The International Thespian Society is an honor organization that recognizes the work of student actors and technicians. Students pay a \$35 dollar fee to become an inducted Thespian. In two weeks our Thespians will be attending the Iowa Thespian State Festival to learn, compete, and become engaged in theatre with hundreds of Thespians across the state.

For the \$35 dollar fee, a student gets - A Thespian induction pin. A personalized membership card and certificate. A one-year subscription to the print edition of Dramatics magazine (a \$38 value) as well as the opportunity to renew that subscription at a special member rate.

Leadership opportunities at the troupe, chapter, and national levels. Eligibility to apply for EdTA grants and scholarships. Eligibility to audition for admission to college theatre programs at the International Thespian Festival.

Eligibility to receive Thespian honor and graduation items. A bumper sticker that reads: Proud parent of a theatre arts honor student.
